The CoolGlide's cooling hand piece increases comfort and safety by soothing and protecting skin as it glides along which provides a partial anesthesia. Our laser hair removal system can be used safely and effectively on all skin types and colors, and is FDA approved for permanent hair reduction. A number of treatments are recommended for optimal hair reduction as an area needs to be treated repeatedly to target hairs in their active growth phase. Over time, laser hair reduction is less costly than waxing.
